TIMSS (Trends International Mathematics and Science Study) International

Benchmarking Test recommended by KHDA is held every 4 years in Science and Mathematics for Grade 4 and Grade 8. TIMSS was held in April 2019 and DIPS was successful in achieving higher than our target score. We have recently completed TIMSS held in May 2023, and we are confident that the result will be significantly higher. The UAE aims to be among the 15 highest-performing countries in TIMSS.

PIRLS (Progress of International Reading and Literacy Study)

The Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS) is an international assessment and research project designed to measure reading achievement at the fourth-grade level, as well as school and teacher practices related to instruction. PIRLS check the reading literacy ability of the student. Reading literacy is the ability to understand and use those written language forms required by society and/or valued by the individual. Readers can construct meaning from texts in a variety of forms. They read to learn, to participate in communities of readers in school and everyday life, and for enjoyment. These include traditional written forms, such as books, magazines, documents, and newspapers, as well as digital forms such as email, text messaging, and Internet websites where a text is often integrated with various multimedia formats.

Students at our school were randomly selected from both Grades 4 as a part of the overall student sample for Dubai. These exams take place every five years. We completed the PIRLS in October 2021. Our next PIRLS is for Grade 4 (field study) in 2026.

PISA (Programme for International Student Assessment)

PISA is the OECD's Programme for International Student Assessment. PISA measures 15-year-olds' ability to use their reading, mathematics and science knowledge and skills to meet real-life challenges. The exam conducts a sample of 15-year-old students to improve the quality of education in Dubai. This exam is done every three years since 2009, the focus was on Reading which includes three sub-domains. **Reading Literacy:** Access and retrieval of information, integration and interpretation from various texts, reflection and evaluation of content and form. **Access & Retrieve:** extraction of information from continuous and non-continuous text. **Integrate and interpret** interpretive analysis of relationships from multiple texts. **Reflect and evaluate** reflection on the content, form and purpose of a text. **Mathematical Literacy:** Replications, connections and reflections on quantity, space, change and uncertainty. **Scientific Literacy:** Identifying scientific and environmental issues, understanding scientific phenomena, and using scientific processes and evidence.

Summary:

We have invested in International and National Benchmarking Assessments to ensure that our assessments are accurate and in-line with National and International standards. The results from these feed into the levels reported to parents throughout the year.



- **GL CAT 4 (Cognitive Ability Tests):** *The Cognitive Abilities Test* provides insight into students' ability to reason across four distinct batteries: **verbal**, **non-verbal**, **quantitative**, and **spatial**. Our students of year 2 and above are answering CAT4.
- **MAP (Measures of Academic Progress):** The MAP is conducted 3 times a year **Grade 3 to Grade 9-English Reading, Language, Maths and Science**
- **NGRT- We will be using The New Group Reading Test (NGRT)** as a standardized assessment to measure the reading skills of students aged 5-16 years against the national average. These test will help us to assess reading skills across a range of domains, with appropriate age-related emphases. Through a variety of exercises, NGRT can assess students' knowledge of phonics, comprehension, decoding ability, vocabulary, grammatical knowledge, deduction and inference skills, authorial intent, and ability to deal with figurative and idiomatic language (depending on the age of the student and test selected).
